COMPLETION OF 1ST PHASE OF DISASTER DEBRIS REMOVAL IN PONCE INLET

We are pleased to announce that the 1st phase of vegetative debris removal is approaching completion, with Coastal Oaks Circle, and the 4400 Block of S. Peninsula Dr. to be wrapped up this weekend.

Please note that we will be starting the 2nd and final pass of storm related vegetative debris and construction debris removal on Monday, November 7th. Please make sure that all storm related debris is separated and is in the right-of way by Monday, November the 7th.

Debris removal crews will not enter onto private property to collect or remove debris.

Residents should **separate** vegetative debris from construction and demolition debris (C&D).

- Vegetative Debris: Trees, limbs, brush, leaves (unbagged)
- Other Debris (C&D): Structural materials, demolition debris, metal, wood, concrete, shingles, carpeting and drywall, etc.

Hazardous materials, such as paint, solvents, batteries and pesticides will not be collected. In addition, no electronic devices or appliances will be accepted during hurricane debris removal.

All debris must be placed in separate piles as noted above, at the curb in the public right-of-way. It is the homeowner's responsibility to bring the debris to the curb and separate it. Right-of-way is the area of residential property that extends from the street to the sidewalk, ditch, utility pole or easement. Do not place debris near water meter vaults, fire hydrants, mail boxes, any above-ground utility and do not block drainage ditches.

Please note that this operation is **ONLY** for disaster debris. Please do not place regular garbage or other household refuse with the disaster debris, it will not be accepted. Household trash and recycling will be picked up on regularly scheduled days by Waste Management.

Bagged and canned lawn debris will continue to be picked up by Waste Management, and **any loose vegetation needs to be canned or bagged** for them to pick up.
