

# **PONCE INLET CITIZEN WATCH**

## **REPORT FOR 2013**

The Ponce Inlet Citizen Watch began 2013 with five officers. One officer, Edward Jackson, had to resign during the year for personal reasons and one new officer, Jeanette Kellum, was added in July.

Citizen Watch Officers contributed a total of 137 (+25%) patrol days and 360 (+2%) man-hours to the Ponce Inlet Police Department. The officers checked 2,378 (+68%) houses during the year along with their other assigned duties, such as traffic control, deliver traffic citations and other duties as assigned by supervisors. It should be noted that while the officers worked 25% more days this year, the number of houses checked increased by 68%. The individual statistics are as follows:

Vic McClellan – 41 patrol days, 129 man-hours and 699 house checks

Joe Lechner – 32 patrol days, 82 man-hours and 506 house checks

Ed Jackson – 3 patrol days, 28 man-hours and 28 house checks (Resigned)

Brandon Roth – 27 patrol days, 82 man-hours and 444 house checks

Robert Bucy – 28 patrol days, 78 man-hours and 580 house checks

Jeanette Kellum – 6 patrol days, 21 man-hours and 121 house checks (New)

It has been our pleasure to serve the police department and we will continue to freely offer our time and service. We have a dedicated group of CWOs and we appreciate the close working relationship we enjoy with the supervisors and officers of the Ponce Inlet Police Department. We are always aggressively soliciting new members and hope to increase our numbers further in 2014
